

# CONSULTATION STRATEGY

## Transport and Logistics Training Package Development Diploma of Logistics Review Project

### Project Purpose Statement

This project will review the Diploma of Logistics (TLI50224) and associated training products as the current requirements no longer reflect modern Supply Chain Management needs. The Transport and Logistics 2025 Workforce Plan highlighted the need to review this qualification to address emerging technologies and digital transformation; environmental, social & governance (ESG) compliance; leadership gaps in compliance, sustainability, and workforce wellbeing; as well as skills for cyber security and data analytics.

### Project Timeline

Overview of major stages in this project. Please note timeframes and dates may change through the progress of the project.

- A Technical Committee (TC) of subject matter experts will be formed for this project to help review and develop training products - commencing in March 2026.
- Approximately 5 TC meetings, with the last meeting serving as the final review and TC signoff
- TC Meetings will be online and between 2 to 4 hours in duration
- Stakeholder Consultation - There will be two Public Consultations during the review and development phase (an additional consultation period will be conducted if required):
  - 1st consultation – December 2026 (4 weeks)
  - 2nd consultation – March 2027 (2 weeks)
- Submission of final draft products for SRO / States and Territories review – July 2027
- Training products submitted to Assurance Body –September 2027
- A Webinar will take place after completion of the project to assist RTO's with implementation advice.

### Stakeholder Consultation
